

ATEK Access Technologies, LLC Conflict Minerals Statement

Dear Datakey Customer:

On August 22, 2012, the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) published the regulations implementing the conflict minerals reporting obligations of Section 1502 of the U.S. Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform Act. ATEK Access Technologies is executing processes and working with our supply chain to ensure that only "DRC Conflict Free" materials are used in our products and provided to our customers.

ATEK Access Technologies does not purchase tin, tantalum, tungsten or gold (3T&G) directly from smelters or mines. However, some of the components in our products do contain these substances. There are many supply chain layers that separate ATEK Access Technologies from the smelters and mines from which these metals are sourced. Therefore, we will require our suppliers to determine the sources and conflict status of these materials (3T&G). We will acquire and maintain records from these suppliers to ensure conformance.

Please be assured that we are focused on providing our customers with conflict-free materials and aligning our suppliers to be compliant with the OECD framework (see OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas). We fully understand the importance of this issue and continue to work with our supply chain.
